### Hazards

Rowing hazards exist when:

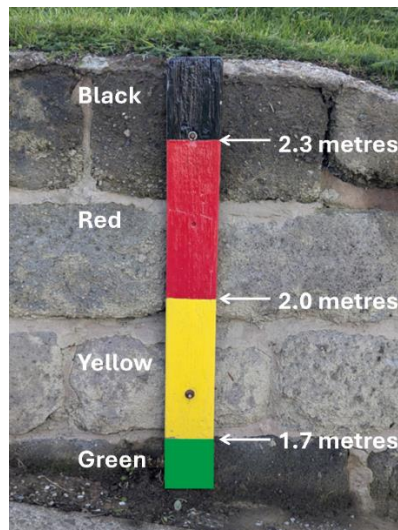
- there is a fast stream, normally during higher river levels,
- the river level is rising rapidly, and
- significant quantity or size of debris is floating in the river.

### Safety Rules

#### River Level

Check the river level before your outing, using one or both methods below:

- The local river level indicator positioned by the Club's slipway, as shown below, and/or
- The Environment Agency website of the current river level at Welsh Bridge and 36 hours ahead prediction, [River Severn level at Welsh Bridge - GOV.UK](#)



Safe rowing boating restrictions for various river level conditions are summarised below.

#### Stream and Debris

The Captain, Coach, Rowing Safety Advisor, or experienced club member will decide if river stream conditions and extent of river debris are safe. They may restrict or prohibit rowing to reduce risk to an acceptable level.

This may occur while the river level remains in the green, yellow, or red zones.

<b>Green</b>	Up to 1.7 m		Boating between Junior look-out stations or English and Welsh Bridges. Outings supervised by Coach. Safety launch available on pontoon.	1x or 2x dedicated boats: stay within sight of clubhouse. 4+/-x beginner boat: between English and Welsh Bridges. No 8+ boats. Supervision by Coach or Club Member. Adaptive crews accompanied by safety launch.	Stay upstream of English Bridge. Can go upstream of Welsh Bridge with an experienced cox, sculler, or crew.	Can use navigable river. Risk assessment to cover upstream of Berwick Turn well upstream of Weir.
